

Your Flipped & Closed Lid

The two diagrams below show the “hand model” of the brain. Complete the following steps:

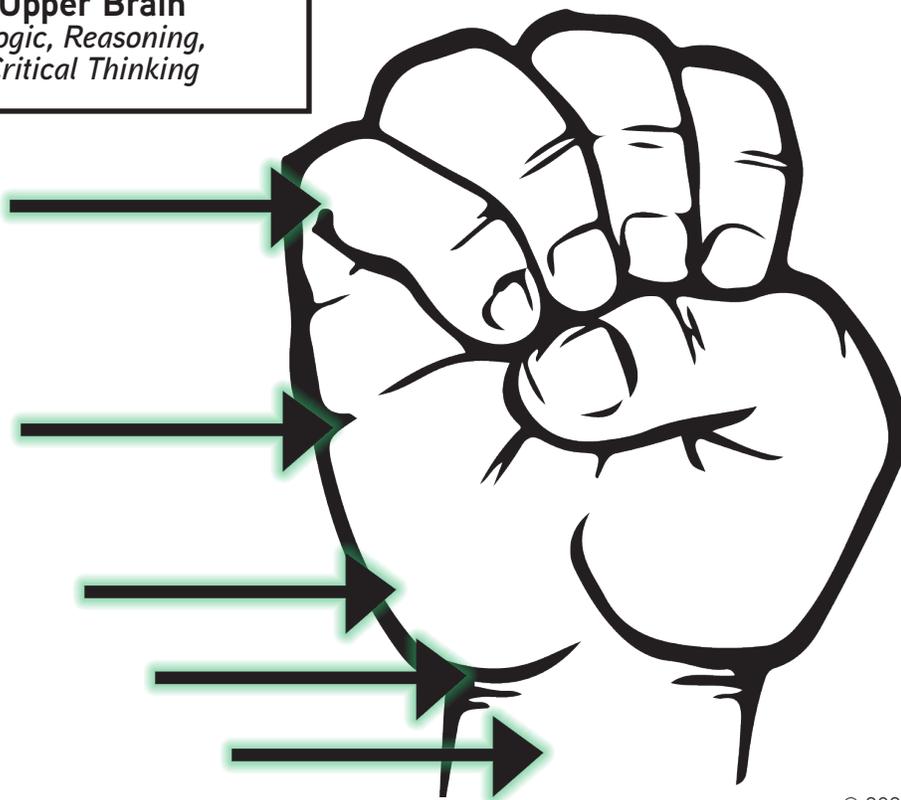
1. Use the **Word Bank** below to label the five different parts of the brain.
2. Create your own *Hand Model of the Brain*: Use either a latex/plastic glove & OR the diagrams on the right to create your own versions of what a **Flipped Lid** and **Closed Lid** brain means to you.

- Think about: What does each segment of your brain — for example, your Upper Brain — look like when your lid flips? Is it anger, disassociation, a meltdown? What imagery or words come to mind?
- Add it on that segment of your hand model using colored markers or digital tools. If doing this activity online & digitally, you can use the google slide tools to draw, find images online to insert/place, or upload images from a device to include.
- Repeat adding images/words for every brain segment.
